The Department of Physical Therapy and Rehabilitation Sciences at Drexel University in the College of Nursing and Health Professions is seeking a dynamic leader and scholar to facilitate the department's visions in research, teaching, clinical practice and service. The Chairperson would oversee 16 FT faculty and 3 staff dedicated to excellence in educating professionals within our existing Professional DPT program, PhD in Rehabilitation Sciences, and post-professional certificates in Hand, Pediatrics and Orthopedic Residency programs starting in 2013. For over 30 years our nationally-ranked programs have used evidence-based practice and strong clinical research to advance the field and prepare students for leadership as research scientists, educators, and clinicians.

The new Chairperson will help us grow our research and clinical practice as we move into a new 21,000 sq. ft. space housing expanded research laboratories and a multidisciplinary clinical practice in Spring 2013. The Department's grant-supported research programs include collaborations with faculty in the College of Medicine, School of Public Health, and School of Biomedical Engineering, Science and Health Systems. Our established and exponentially expanding faculty clinical practice serves the Drexel community, including the athletic and dance departments and a community health center operated by the College of Nursing and Health Professions.

The Department Chair is responsible for the vision, leadership, and administration of the educational, research, service, and clinical practice programs. Additional key responsibilities include budget management and administration, and faculty development and evaluation. The Chairperson must foster a research culture and actively facilitate grant-seeking and research collaborations within the College and University. The Chair serves as the primary voice and advocate for the Department at the College and University levels and represents the Department to external accrediting agencies and the professional community.

1. Research-based doctoral degree (PhD or equivalent), with a record of sustained research productivity that reflects an academic and research record eligible for tenure at Drexel.
 2. Ability and desire to mentor faculty and developing scientists, initiate collaborative projects, and continue an active research agenda.
 3. Understanding and familiarity with the accreditation process, doctoral programs and curriculum development, university teaching, and collaboration within a complex organization.
 4. Experience in an academic administrative leadership role with demonstrated successes is desired.
 5. Eligible for Pennsylvania licensure as a physical therapist.
 6. The successful candidate will be innovative with the personnel management skills to build a shared vision.

This position is a 12-month, tenured faculty appointment. Salary is commensurate with qualifications. Laboratory space and start-up package will be negotiated based upon the candidate's needs and record of research success.
