The 2006 fall **Educational Leadership Conference**, formerly known as AASIG and National Clinical Educator Conference, will be held October 6-8, 2006, in Arlington, VA. This event is sponsored by the Academic Administrators and Clinical Education Special Interest Groups of the Education Section-APTA

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Clinical Educators: Similar to past National Clinical Educator Conferences, this meeting will provide programming for all stakeholders: the CI, the CCCE and the ACCE/DCE. Sessions will include creating a clinical curriculum, CAPTE compliance issues related to clinical education, addressing the needs of novice CCCEs, ACCEs, and roundtable networking for all. Research related to clinical education will be a highlight of this meeting and will include funding strategies, current research platforms and networking opportunities.

Core Curriculum for Population Health: In response to a Healthy People 2010 objective to include core competencies in health promotion and disease prevention in the curriculum for health care providers, a Task Force was formed with support from the Association of Teachers of Preventive Medicine and the Association of Academic Health Centers. This session will allow participants to generate ideas for integrating a curriculum framework for Clinical Prevention and Population Health into physical therapy education curricula.

The Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy Presentation: Learn how to read and utilize the school reports from FSBPT for program evaluation.

Outcomes Data Tools: APTA staff will review tools that will allow education programs to teach students about outcomes data collection. Discussion will primarily focus, but will not be restricted to, the use of OPTIMAL and APTA CONNECT as aids to data collection.

Professional Development Models: What should career development look like for doctors of physical therapy? Autonomous practice requires an even greater responsibility for life-long learning. This session will address the issues related to continued competence and career development for doctors of physical therapy.

Residency/Fellowship: If you are interested in development and implementation of clinical residency and fellowship programs you will be interested in attending this session. The session will provide vital information for program administrators, clinic directors, and academic and clinical faculty. The program will focus on how institutions are collaborating in residency/fellowship education using different models.
